PITAMBAR PANT NATIONAL ENVIRONMENT FELLOWSHIP AWARD

A balanced environment in which humankind and its activities are in perfect harmony with nature is the most precious asset of a country. However, demographic pressures and unsustainable development threaten the life-support system, comprising the basic resources like air, water, land, flora and fauna. Conservation of such resources is today a primary concern of human race. Development programmes to be economically viable must thus ensure that they cause no environmental destruction. To accomplish this, it is essential to provide a strong scientific and technological input in the whole area of environment, which is inherently multidisciplinary in character, encompassing not only a number of branches of the natural sciences, engineering, agriculture and medicine, but also education, socio-economics and law.

Recognizing the inter-relationship, the Government of India in 1978, on the recommendation of the then National Committee on Environmental Planning and Coordination, constituted and Pitambar Pant National Environment Fellowship Award to encourage and recognize excellence in any branch of Research related to the Environmental Sciences. The fellowship is awarded every year on the World Environment Day on June 5. The fellowship is in recognition of significantly important research/development contributions and is also intended to encourage talented individuals to devote themselves to R & D pursuits in the field of environmental sciences for the duration of the fellowship.

Procedure for submission of nomination

Nominations will be invited each year through press advertisement and through the Ministry's website from the following:

- (1) Members of Planning Commission;
- (2) Secretaries of all Central Government Departments/Ministries/
- (3) Secretaries of the various State Governments dealing with Science, Agriculture, Environment, Forestry and Animal Husbandry,
- (4) Members of Science Advisory Committee to the Cabinet; and
- (5) Chairmen of Commissions: Atomic Energy, Space, Oil and Natural Gas, UGC, etc.

- (6) Director General of major R & D organizations: DRDO, ICAR, IC FRE, ICMR, CSIR, Indian Meteorological Department, various Survey Organizations.
- (7) Vice-Chancellors of Universities (including Agricultural Universities). Deans of Science, Engineering and Technology and Medical Facilities;
- (8) Heads and Deans of Faculties of Institutions deemed to be of University status like Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore; All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi; Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Chandigarh; Birla Institute of Technology and Science, Pilani; etc.
- (9) Directors of Indian Institutes of Technologies;
- (10) Directors of CSIR laboratories and Directors of Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Bombay; Bose Institute, Calcutta; Birbal Sahni Institute of Palaeobotany, Lucknow; Forest Research Institute, Dehra Dun, Indian Association for the Cultivation of Science, Calcutta, Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad; Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics, Calcutta; Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Bombay; Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, Dehra Dun; Maharashtra Association for Cultivation of Science, Pune; etc.
- (11) Past Pitambar Pant Fellows;
- (12) Recognized, registered scientific societies/NGOs involved in doing original research in the field of environment.

The University Faculties may recommend persons working in their institution only and route the applications through their Vice-Chancellors. The Deans Faculties in IITs may send their nominations through their Directors. Directors General of R&D agencies, Chairmen of Commissions and Directors of Laboratories may sponsor names of scientists working in their respective organizations. The Directors of CSIR and other approved laboratories institutions may nominate persons working in their own institutions only past Fellows may send nominations of only one person for each year's Registered scientific societies, NGOs doing original research in the field environment can forward one nomination per institution per year. Nominee should below 55 years and his/her application should be supported by at least two fellows of the National Academy of Science/Engineering/Agriculture.

The nominations complete in all respects should be sent on the lines the pro-forma as given in the attachment I by Registered A.D. post in 10 copies and one set of reprints or other documentary evidence of achievements in a confidential sealed cover marked "Pitambar Pant National Environment

Fellowship Award” and addressed to the Adviser(RE) to the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Paryavaran Bhawan, CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, New Delhi-110 003, by 30 June, 2006.

The Bio-data should bring out the work and measurable attainments of the nominee, the importance of the R&D contribution of the nominee and also other measurable evidence of the gains to be achieved by actual implementation of the R&D in the field of Environmental Sciences. A research project proposal must be based on thrust areas identified by the Ministry (Attachment II) and clearly bring out its nature and importance in specific terms elaborating the programme in a phased manner. An institutional certificate is required to be furnished by the nominee as per Attachment III regarding other concurrent fellowships/projects held by him/her along with a non-availability certificate with respect to permanent equipment proposed (within the ambit of the fellowship provisions).

The nominations received will be valid for the year 2005.

Criteria for Selection

The selection will be made by an Awards Committee consisting of eminent scientists/environmentalists nominated for the purpose by the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India. The Government may, own, and in consultation with the Awards Committee, nominate a renowned scientist for this fellowship. In the absence of any suitably qualified nominee or for any other reason, the Government reserves the right to withhold the Award for any particular year. The decision of the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India shall be final.

For selection, the Awards Committee would, among other things, take into account the high quality contribution made and the merits of the proposed research work. The significance of the contributions already made and impact in the field of ecology and environment will also be the criteria for recommending selection. For the purpose of this Award, the term ‘ Environmental Sciences’ will be interpreted in the broadest possible sense and would include all creative pursuits in this field.

Terms of the Award

As said before, the proposed research pursuit of the nominee should be based on the thrust areas identified by the Ministry (Attachment II) and the project proposal selection should be based on utilitarian value to solve the pressing environmental and ecological problems of the country. Subject to this being ensured, the Pitambar Pant National Environment Fellow would be required to work on the project of his/her choice for the duration of the Award. He/She would submit the results of his/her research work to the Ministry of Environment and Forests who would be free to utilise the material in any manner they deem fit. The awardees will make a presentation to the award committee after first and second years and take their suggestions/advice for correction(s), if any. The awardee will submit annual progress report as well as Final Technical Report (Attachment IV) (a) & (b) and render accounts financial year wise in the format prescribed by the Ministry (Attachment V & VI) . The Final Technical Report submitted by the awardee will be placed before the award committee for their perusal, comments (if any), suitable modification of the report by the awardee and final acceptance of the report (complete In all respects) by the Committee.

The fellowship would be for a period of two years. There would be no extension beyond 2 years normal tenure. The National Fellow will receive an award of Rs. 26,000/- per month plus allowances or last pay drawn plus allowances whichever is higher for in-service candidates who opt the award on a whole time basis. In case of retired persons/pensioners or if the awardee desires to work on part-time basis, the fellowship amount will be Rs. 10,000/- per month over and above the retirement benefits/pension/normal salary as the case may be. In either case the fellowship amount is exempt from income tax as per the existing income-tax rules/guidelines during the period of fellowship. In addition, an amount of Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum will be paid to the Fellow for meeting secretarial and contingent expenditure (including domestic travel). He/she will also be entitled to engage one Research Associate or one SRF as per existing government norms/rules. The expenses of the fellowship, stated contingency grant and remuneration of staff will be met by the Ministry of Environment and Forests. The fellowship award and the grants sanctioned thereto will be subject to terms and conditions mentioned in Attachment VII.

Attachment VII

Terms and conditions governing the Research Grants sanctioned to the Grantee organization under Pitamber Pant National Fellowship Award.

1. The grant being released is for that specific project sanctioned and the grant should be exclusively spent on the project for which has been sanctioned, within the stipulated time. The grantee organization is not permitted to seek or utilize funds from any other organization (Government, semi-government, Autonomous or private) for the same research pursuit by the awardee. Any unspent amount, out of the grant given by the Ministry, would be required to be surrendered to the Government of India in the Ministry of Environment and Forests and carry forward of unutilised amount from one financial year to the next financial year for utilization for the same project would require the specific approval of the Ministry of Environment & Forests.
2. For permanent, semi-permanent assets acquired solely or mainly out of the grant, including books and furniture, an audited record in the form of Register (Attachment VIII) shall be maintained by the awardee. The terms "Assets" here means (a) immovable property and (b) movable property of a capital nature where the value exceeds Rs.1000/-.
3. All the assets including equipment and prototypes acquired from the grant will be the property of the Government of India and without the prior sanction of the Ministry of Environment and Forests should not be disposed of or encumbered or utilised for any purpose other than those for which the grant has been sanctioned.
4. At the conclusion of the two year tenure of the fellowship award, the Government of India will be free to sell or otherwise dispose of assets, which are the property of the Government of India. The grantee organization shall render to the Government of India necessary facilities for arranging the sale of these assets. The Government of India has the discretion of gifting the assets to the grantee organization if the Government of India consider it appropriate.
5. The awardee, through the grantee organization, will furnish yearly progress report of the two on the specific project (with 5 copies). The Ministry of Environment and Forests can, if appropriate, depute scientists/specialists to visit the grantee organization for reviewing the progress work and for suggesting such measures as to ensure early realization of the objectives of the Full facilities are to be provided by the grantee organization to the visiting scientists/specialists.
6. No international travel is permitted out of contingency funds.
7. The awardee through the grantee organization, is required to send to the Ministry of Environment and Forests at the end of each financial year and at the time of seeking further instalments of list of assets referred to in (2) above.

8. The grantee organization would furnish to the Ministry of Environment and Forests a Certificates as in he prescribed format (Attachment-VI) within sixty days of the close financial year, i.e. by 31st May, of each year for the grant released during the previous financial year. An audited statement of account (Attachment-V) pertaining to the grant will also have to be furnished within two months of the close of the financial year.
9. Following guidelines may be adopted while accounting the expenditure on HRA and Medical Allowance to the research staff.
 - a) Staff engaged in the research project are not eligible for HRA, if they have been provided quarter/hostel facilities.
 - b) The staff engaged in the project are not eligible for HRA, if the organisation's rules do not provide HRA for its own staff.
 - c) Research staff, who are not provided hostel facilities are eligible for HRA as applicable to scientific staff/teaching staff.
 - d) For the purpose of HRA, fellowship/lump-sum amount for Research Associate, Senior Research Fellows will be taken as basic pay.
 - e) Maximum HRA payable will be limited to recent Pay Commission' recommendations as accepted by the Government of India.
 - f) Medical allowances should be as per the rules of the organization. In respect of non-Governmental organizations, this will be limited to a maximum of Rs. 1000/- per annum.
10. The Comptroller and Auditor General of India at his discretion shall have the right of access to the books and accounts of the grantee organization for the grants received from the Government of India.
11. The grantee organization should maintain separate audited accounts for the fellowship award. If it is found expedient to keep a part or whole of the grant in a bank account earning interest, the interest thus earned should be reported to the Ministry of Environment and Forests. The earned interest will be treated as a credit to the grantee organization to be adjusted towards further instalments of the grant.
12. Sale proceeds, if any, as a result of the development of the project work arising directly from the funds granted by the Ministry of Environment and Forests shall be remitted to the Government of India. Government of India may, at its discretion, allow a portion of such receipts to be retained by grantee organization.
13. The know-how generated from the project will be the property of Government of India and recent way of sale of know-how, royalty, etc. shall accrue to the Government of India. The Government of India may, at its discretion, allow a portion of such receipts to be the grantee organization. The sale of know-how, collection and settling the rate of royalty etc. would be decided by the Ministry of Environment and Forests in consultation with the National Research Development Corporation, public sector undertaking, which has the responsibility for licensing the transfer of know-how research and development projects.
14. Investigators wishing to publish or present papers at conferences based on the research work under the fellowship award should acknowledge the financial support received from the Ministry of Environment and Forests and three copies of the publications/paper shall be sent to the Ministry of Environment and Forests.
15. The awardee and the grantee organization are not permitted to entrust the implementation project work, for which grant is being sanctioned, to any other organization and diversion of the grant or

any portion of it as assistance to any other organization. In case the awardee is not a position to execute or complete the work, he/she is required to refund forthwith to the Government of India. Ministry of Environment and Forests, the entire amount of grant received by it. In exceptional cases this condition may be relaxed by the Government.

16. Ad-hoc Research Staff (RA or SRF), sanctioned for the project work, should be recruited by grantee organization as per existing Department of Science and Technology, Government of India norms within ninety days of issue of sanction order and equipment if any sanctioned, should also be ordered within ninety days.
17. The staff that may be employed for the project by the grantee organization are not to be treated as employees of the Government of India and the deployment of such ad-hoc staff at the time of completion or termination of the project will not be the concern/responsibility of the Government of India. The staff will be subject to administrative control and rules applicable in the organization, where the project is based.
18. The Government of India in the Ministry of Environment and Forests reserves the right to terminate the grant at any stage if convinced that the grant has not been properly utilized by the grantee organization and/or the awardee or appropriate progress is not being made the awardee.
19. The project work of the awardee will become operative with effect from the date on which the grant is received by the grantee organization. The date of receipt of the grant will be intimated by the grantee organization to the Ministry of Environment and Forests.
20. If the awardee leaves the institution, where the project work is originally envisioned to be carried out, he should submit 10 copies of complete and detailed report of the work done on the project till the date of his release. Prior to leaving, the Awardee shall inform the Ministry and get its approval.
21. The duration of the award (two years) includes period for the submission of the final technical report. No additional time will be provided by the Ministry for submission of the final technical report.
22. The Awardee through the grantee organization will furnish 5 copies of a detailed final technical report to the Ministry of Environment and Forests on the outcome of the project work as per the proforma.
23. In case of violation of any of these conditions of the grant or in case of closure or dissolution of the organization, the Government may take possession of all the assets of the organization acquired out of Government grants and use them in any manner deemed appropriate or to recover from the organization the value of such assets at its discretion.
