

Decisions of Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change with respect to import and export of hazardous waste under the Hazardous Waste (Management, Handling & Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2008 as approved by Secretary (E&F) on the basis of recommendation of the 52nd meeting of Expert Committee for appraisal of such applications.

AGENDA ITEM 2.1: APPLICATIONS REGARDING IMPORT OF LEAD SCRAP/ BATTERY SCRAP

2.1.1 M/s Chloride Metals Ltd., Pune (No.23-212/2013-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that applicant has been granted permission previously also and accordingly, Ministry recommended import of 25000 MT of Lead Scrap (ISRI Code: Radio/Rails/Racks/Relay and Ropes).

2.1.2 M/s Sree Sumangla Metals & Industries Pvt. Ltd., Gummidipoondi (No.23-228/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 9000 MT of Lead Scrap (Racks, Relay, Rakes, Rono, Ropes, Radio, Rents and Rails).

2.1.3 M/s Starlit Power Systems Ltd., Mewat (Haryana)(No. 23-86/2014- HSMD):

Decision: The photographs submitted by the applicant were not explicit. To verify the installation of alkaline scrubber and Effluent Treatment Facility, the Ministry recommended the site visit.

AGENDA NO.2.2: IMPORT OF PET SCRAP/PLASTIC SCRAP/ACRYLIC PLASTIC

2.2.1 M/s Alexandria International, Delhi (No.17-16/2014-HSMD):

Decision: During presentation by the applicant, the Committee was informed that he has no facility for recycling of pet bottle and as such his application for import of used pet bottle cannot be considered. He has also applied for import of recycled flakes and granules of PET. The Committee advised him to make a fresh application for recycled flakes and granules of PET.

2.2.2 M/s Maxtar Industries, Bhopal (No.23-227/2014-HSMD):

Decision: Since this is first application to the Ministry for import, the Ministry recommended site visit before considering the case.

2.2.3 M/s Jain Tubes Corporation, Falna (Raj.) (No.17-18/2009-HSMD):

Decision: The application is not accompanied by valid CTO, the decision on the application is deferred by the Ministry.

2.2.4 M/s Aaon Industries, Rajkot (No.17-7/2014-HSMD):

Decision: It is clarified that PET bottle scrap includes 'cap' and 'labels' on the scrap PET bottles.

2.2.5 M/s Shakti Plastic Industries, Thane (No.5-24/2012-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 1600 MT of virgin plastic scrap (LDPE/LLDPE/HDPE/PP).

AGENDA NO.2.3: IMPORT OF RUBBER SCRAP ETC.

2.3.1 M/s Shivalik Reclamations Pvt. Ltd., Gurgaon (No.23-60/2009-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that applicant has got permission many time previously also and recommended the import of 5000 MT of Tyre Crumb Powder, Tyre scrap buffing, tyre scrap (used & Old tyres cut in 2/3 pcs). However, the approval may be issued after receipt of valid CTO.

2.3.2 M/s Tinna Rubber and Infrastructure Ltd., New Delhi (No 5-22/2010- HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that applicant has got permission many time previously also and recommended the import of 5000 MT of Tyres Scrap for Gummidipundi Plant.

2.3.3 M/s Platinum Rubbers Pvt. Ltd., Delhi (No.5-11/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 1500 MT of old/used rubber tyres (Cut/shredded/Press Baled).

2.3.4 M/s Talampally Rubbers Pvt. Ltd., Bidar (No.23-117/2104-HSMD):

Decision: Taking note of the proof of fibre separator, the Ministry recommended import of 5000 MT used Rubber Tyres (one cut in bead wire/parings, hard rubber/powder and granules).

2.3.5 M/s NRMG Industries, Chandaparru (A.P.) (No.5-31/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The committee agreed to the proposed amendment (amendment in the existing permission as cut in 2&3 pcs or multiple cuts or shredded form or baled form).

2.3.6 M/s Klean Industries, Thane (No.5-15/2014-HSMD):

Decision: Since the applicant has applied for first time for import, the Ministry recommended site visit before considering the case further.

2.3.7 M/s Shree Ganesh Rubber Products, Navi Mumbai (No.23-230/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended a site visit by the Chairman before considering the case further.

2.3.8 M/s Green Rubber Industries, Sonapat (No.23-229/2014-HSMD):

Decision: Since the application for import is received for first time, the Ministry recommended site visit before further consideration.

2.3.9 M/s Shree Vinayak Enterprise, Rajkot (No.23-232/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Ministry recommended site visit by zonal office of CPCB before considering the case further. During the visit the arrangement for ensuring that fibres do not get into the environment has to be specifically seen.

2.3.10 M/s Sunflex Recycling Pvt. Ltd., Ahmedabad (No.23-235/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended site visit by zonal office of CPCB before considering the case further. During the visit the arrangement for

ensuring that fibres do not get into the environment has to be specifically seen.

2.3.11 M/s Ambuja Cement Ltd., Gujarat (No.23-12/2009-HSMD):

Decision: Since the applicant was not available for presentation the Ministry deferred the decision.

2.3.12 M/s Tirupati Udyog, Faridbad (No.5-34/2014-HSMD):

Decision: Since the application for import has been received for first time, the Ministry recommended site visit before considering the case further.

2.3.13 M/s Balaji Udyog, Dist. Churu (Raj.) (No.5-33/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The committee suggested to the applicant to install adequate air pollution control system particularly for fibres. Thereafter, a site visit may be undertaken and then the case would be considered.

2.3.14 M/s Eswar Rubber Products Pvt. Ltd., Salem (T.N.) (no. 23-169/2014- HSMD)

Decision: The Ministry deferred the decision as the proponent was not available for presentation.

2.3.15 M/s Sri Shakti Rubber Industries, Krishna Dist. (Andhra Pradesh)(23-168/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Ministry recommended a site visit by the Bangalore Z.O. of CPCB. During the visit the arrangement for ensuring that fibres do not get into the environment has to be specifically seen.

2.3.16. M/s Avlan Rubber Industry, Guntur (A.P.) (F. No. 23-90 / 2014-HSM)

Decision: The unit Committee took note of the inspection report submitted by CPCB. Based on the recommendation of the CPCB, the Ministry recommended the import of 1200 MT of multi cut radial tyre only.

2.3.17. M/s Peters tyre recycling, Kerala (F.No. 5-4 / 2014- HSMD).

Decision: The Committee took note of the inspection report submitted by CPCB. Based on the recommendation of the CPCB, the Ministry recommended the import of 1200 MT of multi cut radial tyre only.

AGENDA NO.2.4: IMPORT OF SOLID RECOVERED FUEL (SRF) ETC:

2.4.1 M/s Bharathi Cement Corporation Pvt. Ltd., Hyderabad (No.23-248/2013-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that Form 7&8 with the application was not there. Further, there is no clarity on purpose of the import, the decision on the application was deferred and the applicant was called for presentation/ technical discussion in the next meeting.

AGENDA NO. 2.5: IMPORT OF GLASS CULLET SCRAP ETC:

2.5.1 M/s Surya Roshni Ltd., New Delhi (No.23-59/2009-HSMD) :

Decision: The Committee noted that applicant had been granted permission previously also. The Ministry recommended import of 2500 MT of glass cullet (non-activated).

2.5.2 M/s Videocon Industries Ltd., Bharuch (No.23-12/2008-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 1,00,000 MT of glass cullet (non-activated).

AGENDA NO.2.6: IMPORT OF USED EEAS ON LOAN/ TESTING PURPOSE/ PROJECTS / R&D / REPAIR /RETURNABLE BASIS ETC:

2.6.1 M/s Abbott Medical Optics Pvt. Ltd., Gurgaon (No.23-54/2012-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that these spare parts are required for warranty replacement and equivalent number of defective components will be exported. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.2 M/s Olympic Pharmacare Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi (No.23-215/2014-HSMD):

Decision: During presentation, the Committee was informed that these machines have already been imported and thus it is an illegal import. Moreover, the machines are quite old, the year of manufacture being 2004, 2003, 1999 and another without any date of manufacture. Also only one out of the four machines has been reconditioned as per the report. The Ministry therefore recommend for re-export of the said medical equipment.

2.6.3 M/s Semi-Conductor Laboratory, Delhi (No.23-174/2013-HSMD):

Decision: The recommended import of 01+01 of refurbished PRI Robot Controller and refurbished Pre-Aligner.

2.6.4 M/s Groz-Beckert Asia (P) Ltd., Chandigarh (No.23-25/2012-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee observed that the proposal is to import used and refurbished grinding machine. This is predominantly a mechanical machine except the motor and as such does not require permission of this Ministry.

2.6.5 M/s Vinni Chemicals Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi (No.23-163/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee was informed that the instrument is required for testing the quality of the engine coolant. The instrument is being obtained from Prestone with whom the applicant has technical collaboration and according to them the instrument has been refurbished. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.6 M/s Denso Pricol India Ltd., Gurgaon (No.23-220/2014-HSMD) :

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 01 no. of inspection machine.

2.6.7 M/s Vinatech Medical Systems Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi (No.23-289/2012-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the machines are 2008, 2009 and 2010 make and are refurbished and have life expectancy of 5 to 7 years as per CEC. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.8 M/s Mercedes-Benz Research and Development India Pvt Ltd., Bangalore. (No.23-217/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee was informed that these items are being imported from the parent company Mercedes Benz Germany and are meant for testing

and validation. As per the CEC, the residual life of these items is 12 years. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.9 M/s SRF Ltd., Gurgaon. (No.23-216/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee suggested that the applicant may be called for presentation in the next meeting.

2.6.10 M/s Alcatel Lucent India Ltd., Bangalore (No.23-68/2011-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee was informed that these items are being imported from their sister concern Alcatel Lucent France for R&D purpose. They will be sent back within three years. The Committee recommended import with respect to both the above applications. With respect to transfer of second hand imported items to some other company, the Committee was of the view that transfer of such items on loan may be permitted provided the responsibility for re-export within the specified period remains with Alcatel Lucent India.

2.6.11 M/s Apple India Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore (No.23-198/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee observed that the number of second hand items for import was too large and the purpose of import was not apparent. The applicant was called for presentation in the next meeting. The decision on the application was deferred by the Ministry.

2.6.12 M/s R.R. Impex, Delhi (No.23-218/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee observed that the proposal is to import used and refurbished circular knitting machine. This is predominantly a mechanical machine except the motor and as such does not require permission of this Ministry.

2.6.13 M/s Hewlett-Packard India sales Pvt. Ltd., Gurgaon (No.23-31/2011-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee was informed that these items are for warranty replacement and will be accompanied by CEC. The defective components in equal number will be exported prior to import. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.14 M/s Tata Flexi Ltd., Trivandrum (No.23-107/2013-HSMD)

Decision: Most of the items are 2009 and 2010 make and were used in their own office in US. The office is closed and the all the electronic items are being shifted to Bangalore office. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.15 M/s General Instrument Corporation India Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore (No.23-181/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee observed that the information provided by the applicant is not complete in many respects like CEC certifying the functionality, the date of manufacture, serial no., and whether these items will be sent back after carrying out testing work. Further, the equipment's list to be imported was also not provided. The Ministry therefore recommended that the requisite information should be first provided by the applicant for consideration of their case.

2.6.16 M/s Honeywell Technology Solutions Lab Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore (No.23-26/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee was informed that these items are being imported for testing purposes from their parent company Honeywell USA. They will be sent back within six months. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.17 M/s Philips India Ltd., Gurgaon (No.23-207/2013-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee observed that make of MRI unit was 2007 and refurbished in 2014 by Philip i.e. OEM itself. The Ministry therefore recommended the import.

2.6.18 M/s Shields Environmental Services Pvt. Ltd., Gurgaon (Haryana) (No.23-228/2013-HSMD)

Decision: The committee considered the application for BTS test set. The CE from exporting country has certified that it has residual life of 8 to 10 years. The 30000 cards proposed to be imported are faulty card for repair. All these cards after repair will be exported back to the exporting country within a period of six months. The Ministry therefore recommends the import of both the above stated items.

2.6.19 M/s R Yadav Surgical and Rekha Eye Hospital, Rewari (23-223/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee recommended that the importer may be called for presentation. The decision on the application was deferred by the Ministry.

2.6.20 M/s Aricent Technologies (Holdings) Ltd., Bangalore (No.23-30/2012-HSMD):

Decision: As the CEC was not found to be enclosed with the application. The Ministry deferred the decision and called the applicant for presentation in the next meeting.

2.6.21 M/s Sapphire Digital Printers, Gurgaon (No.23-178/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The purpose of import was not apparent. The applicant was called for presentation in the next meeting by the Ministry.

2.6.22 M/s Brahmagiri Development Society Wayanad, Kerala (No.5-32/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee observed that it is a mechanical item. Hence, the permission from this Ministry is not required.

2.6.23 M/s Sai Hivac Enterprises, Ghaziabad (No.23-214/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee was informed that the item has already been imported and is thus illegal import. The year of manufacture of the item is also not known. Moreover, the leak detectors are being made in the country. The Ministry therefore recommended re-export.

2.6.24 M/s BNN Communication Engineers, Sahibabad (NO.23-181/2013-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended the extension of time by six months for re-export.

2.6.25 M/s Intel Mobile Communications, Bangalore (No.23-76/2011-HSMD):

Decision: Since the number is large. The Committee recommended that the applicant may be called for presentation in the next meeting. The decision on the application was deferred by the Ministry.

2.6.26 M/s Freescale Semiconductor India Pvt. Ltd., Noida (No.23-136/2013-HSMD):

Decision: (i) The Committee was informed that the item would be exported back within three years. The Committee recommended the import; (ii) the Committee was informed that the main instrument is 2002 make but has been refurbished and has been certified to have residual life of five years; and (iii) the probes (4 nos.) are 2014 make. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.27 M/s Ericsson India Pvt. Ltd., Jaipur (No.23-81/2011-HSMD)

Decision: The committee noted that the item is a steel chamber along with the blower, heating element and temperature indicator. The Ministry therefore, recommended the import.

2.6.28 M/s Alere Medical Pvt. Ltd., Rewari (No.23-97/2011-HSMD):

Decision: Since the purpose of import was not clear and the application was not accompanied by CEC, the Committee recommended that the applicant may be called for presentation in the next meeting. The decision on the application was deferred by the Ministry.

2.6.29: M/s Shree Venus Energy System Pvt. Ltd., Chennai (No.23-185/2014-HSMD) :

Decision: These are spare parts of CNC cutting machine which they already have. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.30 M/s Jabil global Services India Pvt. Ltd., Manesar (No. 23-82/2011- HSMD)

Decision: The applicant has now submitted the paper indicating that the importer is a repairing unit and not an OEM. The Committee noted that a sub-committee of the Ministry has visited their operation and found the facility to be good. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.6.31 M/s National Geophysical Research Institute (CSIR), Hyderabad (No. 23-242/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Committee was informed that these items are being imported for geological survey and will be returned within three months. The Ministry recommended the import.

AGENDA NO.2.7: IMPORT OF USED OIL ETC.

2.7.1 M/s ABC Organics & Chemicals, Bharuch (Gujarat) (23-42/2011-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee asked the applicant to furnish valid CTO and Authorization for consideration of the case in next meeting. The applicant

was also asked to furnish typical analysis of the waste lubricating oil proposed to be imported along with the details of source of generation.

2.7.2 M/s Western India Petrochem Industries, Bhavanagar (No.23-236/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant has registration for recycling of 3660 KL used oil and also CTO from SPCB. The Ministry recommended import of 1200 KL of waste lubricating oil (A-3020 of Schedule-III) with the following stipulations:

1. PIC from exporting country.
2. The waste lubricating oil to meet the specification as per Schedule-V Part-A of the HWM Rules, 2008.

AGENDA NO.2.8: IMPORT OF TITANIUM SCRAP ETC.

2.8.1 M/s Minex Metallurgical Co. Ltd., Mumbai (No.5-22/2014-HSMD) :

Decision: The committee noted that the titanium scrap is ** item in Schedule III D (B 1010) of HW Rules, 2008 and is thus free to be imported by actual user and by traders who have one time registration from concerned SPCB/PCC on behalf of actual user. Import permission from Ministry is not required.

AGENDA NO.3.1: EXPORT OF SPENT CATALYST OF AUTOMOBILE/BATTERIES SCRAP ETC /E-WASTE.

3.1.1 M/s Tonchi Sochi PGM Company, New Delhi (No.23-285/2012-HSMD)

Decision: The Ministry recommended the export (60 MT Spent Catalyst of automobile and petro-chemical Industries (Ceramic/Metallic Broken).

3.1.2 M/s Enviro Metals Waste Management India Pvt. Ltd., Kanchipuram (T.N.) (No.23-219/2014-HSMD)

Decision: The Ministry recommended the export (60 MT of Hard Disc Drive Scrap).

3.1.3 M/s Schlumberger Asia Services Ltd., Navi Mumbai (No.23-7/2010-HSMD)

Decision: The Ministry recommended the export (10,000KG of Lithium Batteries (Metal) and 2000Kg of Lithium Metal Batteries).
